Application Deadline: February 28, 2026

Administered by the Preferred Foundation, a corporate giving entity of Preferred Mutual Insurance Company, the Irad and Jan Ingraham/Honeywell Memorial Scholarship has been awarded since 2001 to Unadilla Valley High School Seniors who have a demonstrated record of strong community service and an academic standing of 85 or above. Two scholarships are available, with the first place scholarship winner receiving \$1,500 each year for up to four years, and the second place winner receiving \$1,000 each year for up to four years.

Selection is based on review of the application and the required materials documenting community service, academic performance and activities. A personal interview is also part of the selection process for finalists. Scholarship money may be used to pay tuition, room and board, and other college fees. Disbursement will be made upon receipt of bills due or proof of payment made. Funds will be released to the appropriate party.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Unadilla Valley High School Seniors who have a demonstrated record of strong community service and an average academic standing of 85 or above are eligible.
